Supply List for JCA Painting – Fall 2018

Hello Everyone. Here is the supply list for my JCA Painting class this Fall 2018. I don't want everyone to spend a ton of money, so I am going to keep this list very simple. One thing to keep in mind about several of the colours that we will be using: some of these colours in their purer mix are sometimes quite expensive. If you are not familiar, there are mixes of colours available in oil paints called hues. If you find that the pure tube of paint (ex. Cerulean blue) is too expensive in the brand you choose, a cerulean blue hue will be just fine. I find that ordering supplies online, when you know what you want is much cheaper than buying them in the stores we have here in Jacksonville. Dick Blick online is a great value. You will not need large tubes of paint. The small ones will suffice. With that said, here is the list:

Titanium White
Cadmium Yellow Light
Yellow Ochre
Cadmium Orange
Cadmium Red
Alizarin Crimson
Cerulean Blue
French Ultramarine Blue
Burnt Umber
Burnt Sienna
Viridian Green

Two small to medium size palette knives

Brushes of your choosing. Make sure that you are getting acrylic painting brushes and not watercolour brushes. Get a variety. You will not need large brushes. I find if you have two of each kind of brush you will be set. Look for a small and a medium round brush, small and medium filbert, at least one liner brush and perhaps a small and medium flat brush. Purchasing a ready packaged set of oil brushes ensures that you will have the variety that you need. However, these ready-made packs often are low quality. If you already have brushes that you enjoy and are familiar with - Wonderful! Do not buy more. If you are new to painting, one of these packs should serve you for this class.

A small bottle of Gamsol or other odorless mineral fine art solvent. (Mineral spirits) This is to thin paint and clean brushes.

A small bottle of fine linseed oil or walnut oil. This is used to thin the paint.

Palette. Now here is a funny one. I use a piece of cut glass available from the Home Depot. They come in ready-made sizes and run from \$2 -10. Glass allows the paint to stay wet longer and is very versatile when mixing colours with your palette knife. They are also very easy to clean. You can take the

cardboard wrapper that the glass comes in, turn it upside down and tape the white backing to show up through the glass. Painting on a white surface will help you keep your colour mixes accurate. Tape the edges with masking tape so that you don't cut yourself, and you have a perfect all use palette. For This class 11"x14" should suffice. They are precut in that size. If you do not want to use glass, a plastic or wooden palette will be fine. They come in all shapes and sizes. Please choose what you are most comfortable with. Keep in mind we will be premixing colours, so get something you feel like you will have enough space on. Also available is a pad of palette paper.

A Carry---all. Something to carry everything in.

Several rags. Old T---shirts are great. Cut them into squares. You don't want a big piece of material getting in the way. Also, blue auto shop towels work well. If nothing else, bring some paper towels.

You will need two 16"x20" canvases. These are available at any arts and crafts store. Get at least two. Often these come in packs of 5 or so and can be a good bargain. Also, if you make a total mess of one and want to start over, you will have extra.

Although wordy, this is a very basic set of supplies for any painter: novice or professional. If the need should arise, I will amend this list, and have it posted on the website. I am really looking forward to meeting you all and sharing several weeks of creativity and painting together.
